As we bid farewell to another exciting half-term, we wanted to take a moment to share with you all the wonderful adventures and discoveries your little ones have embarked upon.

Our big question this half term has been 'Who are the people who help us?' We have been learning all about people who help us through our love of books. In 3-4s, we have used the non-fiction book 'Heroes Who Help Us' to find out about their roles and how they help us.

We were delighted to welcome members of our local community police force to nursery. The children had the opportunity to meet these real life heroes, learn about their important role in keeping our community safe, and even got the chance to try the different clothes they need for their job. A big thank you to our community police for taking the time to connect with the children.

The children have also been excited to explore the outdoor environment with all the changes in weather. We discovered hidden patches of ice which led us to make our own ice cubes, sparking curious discussions about freezing and melting. We were also very excited to wake up to find it had snowed and we loved exploring the snow, making tracks and building snowmen.









Our three and four year olds have shown a keen interest in sharks! We delved into the depths of the ocean to uncover some jaw-dropping facts about this incredible creature. The children had lots of questions and we worked together to find the answers.
